The pediatric office serves children and adolescents in the surrounding college community in beautiful southeast Ohio. The community hospital is a level one nursery having 650 deliveries a year. This position requires a DO or MD degree, completion of a pediatric residency board certified or eligible in pediatrics, DEA licensure and Ohio licensure or credentials allowing the same.
